All sections of this website are maintained either weekly, such as the research pages of the website offering specific commodity price charts and information on market trends, or daily, such as the news section, as can be seen from how new relevant stories are uploaded each day, and thus supplies both the industry and consumers with up to date information.

Across the site there are a range of topics dealt with extending from the specifically industry relevant to the more wide ranging. Specific topics covered have included the best-selling commodities in the markets, market behaviour, any specific breaking news relevant to a particular area be it soft commodities or any other of the agricommodities such as new government regulations. By contrast the more general, world-wide breaking news includes headlines such as the financial state of the EU, and dubious future of the Euro.

In this way, by restricting access to certain areas of the site, and tailoring the information displayed on the pages to a particular audience, this website is able to offer relevant information to any of their users, without having sacrifice on detail when it comes to more specialist information.
