There are limitations to price comparison websites however, so it can be useful to extend your research into visiting the home pages of energy suppliers you're interested in, for more reliable and timely information on the latest tariffs. It's often the case that promotions and special offers are only included in official sources, and some price comparison websites may be in partnership with certain suppliers, which can impair the reliability of these results.

After you compare energy prices and you've found the tariff that's right for you, you should also check for any other ways you can save money. Some providers offer discounted rates overall when signing up for a longer term contract, and you could also receive discounts when paying your bills by direct debit.
