According to research, majority of landlords hand over this task to qualified and dedicated agents and take advantage of their expert knowledge of the local market. You will also not be required to deal directly with potential tenants. An agent will not only filter suitable tenants for you but will also negotiate with them and arrange for viewings.

Letting the property

Once you have found your tenants, the next step is to enter into an agreement. In order to manage your Edinburgh flats to rent, you can hire a managing agent to do it on your behalf or you can do the entire thing on your own. The managing agent will provide you with professional advice and guidance throughout the term of the tenancy, create inventories, collect rent, arrange for repairs etc.
