Make sure that mirrors, and switches are functional, and that upholstery and carpets are in acceptable shape and condition. Are all the seats evenly padded, adjustable, and comfortable? Aside from these factors, check all the safety features of the used vehicle. Inspect the headlights, emergency brake, seatbelts, and windshield wipers to ensure that they work properly.

## Test Drive Proper

During the test drive, adjust the driver's seat according to your comfort and convenience. Check if the car is easy to start and if the gears shift effortlessly. Ensure that the clutch is easy to engage, and that no unusual noise occurs while changing gears. Check the vehicle's maneuverability, cruise control, and acceleration. Take the car out for at least 30 minutes and drive it in different road conditions. Inspect, too, the air conditioning and heating systems, radio reception, and sound system.

After you have driven the car around your town or city, take a few minutes to walk around and open the hood of the car. After 30 minutes of driving, there should not be any dripping fluid or billowing smoke from the exhaust system.
