Who

Those who do professional tax preparation in the states are currently either working in private practice or work with a larger tax preparation company. Generally, these people get training in tax law along with other tax related matters prior to preparing taxes.

This might involve complex schemes that are legal in which more income is often shielded from taxation. Today, it's not unusual to see large corporations that pay less than 5% rate on their own income due to these tax moves.

Many people know that the United States tax laws are complex. That's the reason over fifty percent of all individual tax returns are still performed by professional tax preparation professionals. It is estimated that taxpayers will require over 10 hours of labor in order to do their own return. Many people don't wish to invest that much time or even more in preparing a tax return.

All they want to do is to submit their forms to some tax preparer and obtain the great news that there is a refund coming.
