Exploring Spain by road; ride from Avila to Segovia by [Jammy](#)

For all those travelers out there who want to experience an aura of gothic and renaissance centuries, Central Spain is the place for you. "Ávila de los Caballeros" is a Spanish city located in the autonomous community of Castile and León. It is famous for its Cathedral of Ávila and Apse of the Cathedral.

Cathedral of Avila can be visited by public transports operating in Spain, however to explore true relics of age old Spanish culture it is advisable to visit the city with a rental car. One can either hire a car from the airport of Madrid which is some 15 km away from Madrid central or in Madrid itself. There are several Alquiler de coches i.e. car rental operating in all over Spain. An advance booking can also be made at [www.compararalquilerdecoches.es](http://www.compararalquilerdecoches.es).

This cultural city has the Romanesque churches of San Vicente that was built in 12th-14th centuries. Some other attractions of the city are San Pedro and the Monastery of Santo Tomás that was the summer residence of the Catholic Monarchs during 15th century. The city still maintains an appearance of sobriety and classicism with a touch of early Gothicism in its structures.

The city is encircled with classic architecture. Before entering the city, do take a round of city in alquiler de coche to see Portada de los Apostles with strong gothic connotations in the north of the city. And a covered gateway of Burundian style towers in Western front. After you are done with Avila on the way to Segovia, the national heritage of Spain, you can explore mystic Castle of La Mota in the city of Medina del Campo. It is a reconstructed medieval fortress. Then take a stop to visit The Parador de Benavente, a town that has several Romanesque churches (it's worth a stop here). The Parador is classic mid-80s Castilian style, well-situated place.

Lastly, you can take a stoppage at Ponferrada, it is noted for its Castillo de los Templarios, a Templar castle which covers approximately 16,000 square meters. In 1178, Ferdinand II of León donated the city to the Templar order for protecting the pilgrims on the Way of St. James who passed through El Bierzo in their road to Santiago de Compostela. This cities lie on the road route to Segovia and are good for short stays. A distance of 344 Km in alquiler de coach thus will not be trying for you. .

Segovia and its Aqueduct were declared World Heritage by UNESCO in 1985. Within old city, stand diversity of historic buildings both civil and religious, not just Catholics but also Jews. The famous church of Corpus, and the Jewish cemetery located in "El Pinarillo" is the most important Jewish palace of the Spanish aljamas.

The Aqueduct of Segovia, located in the emblematic Plaza del Azoguejo, (well connected to avail alquiler de coach services) is attached to the city. The date of its construction is estimated at the end of the 1st century or early 2nd century, makes it the best of roman civil engineering work. It is said that about 25,000 granite blocks were put together without any mortar to build this 818 meters tall construction. So hire your Alquiler de coches right on and get set to explore the Romanian era in Spain.
