Albany is a city in Dougherty County, in the southwest portion of Georgia. The place was once referred as Thronateeska by its former citizens, the Creek Indians. The former name means "œflint" stone, derived from the Flint River. The city is now one of the most well-known minority-majority areas in America today. This suggests that a "minority" racial group, in this case the African American people, has a larger population than white people, who form the majority of the population in most of the US.

Albany's high population of Black Americans is credited to its being a primary producer of cotton. In 1840, Dougherty County came to be very developed, mostly because of Albany's cotton plantations. These plantations had a big population of African slaves who chose cotton. When slavery was ended, these Black Americans stayed in Albany and outranked all additional ethnic groups in number.

Nevertheless, despite their numbers, Georgia's black population was dramatically mistreated for generations. Numerous of them were victims of lynching, and men and women were compelled to carry firearms to protect themselves from the Ku Klux Klan. In the 1960s, the first mass protests were initiated, giving birth to the Civil Rights Movement. This initiated as the Albany Movement, which is now commemorated in the Albany Civil Rights Institute.

The Albany Civil Rights Institute acknowledges the lengthy efforts of African Americans in the name of liberty and equality. Their efforts have paved the way for promoting harmonious connections between the numerous ethnic groups in America, where they can all understand one another as sisters and brothers. The Albany Civil Rights Institute features lots of Albany GA events such as concerts acknowledging the power of songs in the Civil Rights Movement.

The Albany Museum of Art has lots of exhibits and galleries that consist of African, European, and American art collections. The Albany Museum of Art also displays collections from contributing artists from around the nation and worldwide.

Located in the Riverfront Park is the Ray Charles Plaza, which is amongst the most prominent Albany GA attractions. It honors Ray Charles, the blind African American musical artist touted as the leader of soul music. Born in Albany City, Ray Charles gives honor to his home state in the track "Georgia on My Mind."
