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The changing U.S. economy and the desire of many functioning people to 'make a difference' after the actions of September 11 have contributed to a mounting concentration in nurture as a career. Moreover, over one million new and replacement RNs will be desirable in the United States by 2016, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. In response to these factors, nursing schools are contribution new ways to attract and rapidly train more nurses while maintains the quality and truth of nursing education on the whole.

A popular move toward is the second degree nursing program. Now and then called accelerated nursing programs, they permit persons who already have a baccalaureate degree (BA) from a credited university or college in an area other than treatment to obtain the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree in beneath four years. These programs are obtainable at both baccalaureate schools and master's degree (MA) levels.

Second degree programs recognize all course units productively done by students in their first degree. This well fulfills the basics of a BSN plan. Loads of second degree BSN programs can be complete in 12 to 18 months, while MSN programs considered for non-nursing graduates habitually take three years to inclusive. The accelerated life of these programs makes them especially appropriate for people who are looking to make a career change, but the pace of the programs can be not easy. Typical second degree nursing students have a propensity to be older and further motivated, with higher academic opportunity than students who enter traditional nursing programs precise out of high school. Students in second degree nursing programs usually have high grade-point averages and nearly always pass their licensing exams on the initial try.

Admission standards for second degree nursing programs are high and more often than not require a 3.0 GPA at minimum. Persons involved in such programs must make a official application to the educational institution of their choice and meet all of its admission requirements. College transcripts are reviewed to ensure that all basics for a second degree treatment program are met.

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
