Whether or not the credit consolidation services you are considering charge up-front fees will play a huge role with all of your decisions. We will not mince words right here. With very few exceptions this is no longer legal. This is a problem for any consumer if they where to answer yes to this question. There should be no reason for anyone to even continue speaking with them at all. Now would be a good time to forget about them and start looking in another direction for your consolidation needs.

Credit consolidation services who are worth anything will always be more then willing with discussing the qualifications of their entire staff. If there is anything your not sure of or may have concerns or questions about should be dealt with quickly and in great detail. Don't let them give you anything but straight forward and honest answers. I would say it would be time to move on to the next credit consolidation program if they try to pull a fast one by you on this important item on your list.

The last question these credit consolidation services must answer is about their accreditation and if they have had any complaints by clients past or present on their record.
