How to Choose an Egg Donor Atlanta Program with High Pregnancy Success Rates

It can be difficult to choose an egg donor in Atlanta program, especially as there are many reputable programs in the United States. Many couples choose a program based on location because they are within close proximity to the clinics and doctors, cutting out the need to travel. Some programs also only accept donors from the same state, which eliminates the need for traveling to appointments. This keeps the cost of using an egg donor lower, compared to paying for a donor that has to travel to her appointments, stay in hotels and have dependable transportation.

If you decide on an egg donor Atlanta program to help conceive a child, rest assured that you are starting your search in a wonderful state. There are several programs that are deeply committed to their recipient families and donors, ensuring that perfect matches are made and pregnancy rates remain steady. As the recipient couple, you are probably wondering what you can expect from an Atlanta donor program in terms of success. After all, understanding success rates can be difficult, especially when numbers aren't consistent.

Generally speaking, donor programs have their own success rates, which is why it can get confusing to get a clear picture. Success rate refers to the percentage of embryo transfers that result in live births. At this time, approximately 2,000 babies have been born via egg donations. On a national level, the success rates are 55.1 percent according to the Society for Assisted Reproductive Technologies. This information is pulled from over 9,000 transfers with two embryos being transferred on average. Although success rates are higher when using fresh eggs, they are still significant with frozen eggs, with a 33.8 percent success rate.

Furthermore, the success rates when using donor eggs are much higher than a traditional IVF procedure, as the eggs are coming from young, fertile women. Generally when an IVF procedure is being done, it is because the couple is struggling with fertility issues that are often due to complications with the ovaries, especially in the cases of women over 40. In fact, SART found that women over 40 have a five times greater chance of conceiving using donor eggs instead of their own eggs.

Since success rates vary between egg donor Atlanta programs, it's important that you evaluate how many live births the clinic has had. Remember that many factors affect the success rate, including the age of the donor, the egg retrieval process, the quality of semen and the number of fertilized eggs. A lot of programs will pride themselves on high quality donors that result in more live births, but really, much of the egg donation process is up to the natural process of conception. However, it is critical that the egg donor program has strict criteria in place for their donors in regards to age and health and preferably, a verification egg freezing technique that preserves the egg instantly.

If an egg donation is your last hope for conceiving a child, success rates are very important. It's crucial that you are not misinformed however, as success rates are not as clear cut as you may believe. The egg donor will have her eggs retrieved, but these are only the eggs that are part of her normal cycle. One egg is chosen to drop, but others are considered for the process. The eggs that are not dropped are naturally absorbed into the body, but with the egg donor process, they are made mature. Therefore, one cycle may only have a few eggs, and some may not make it through the freezing cycle, while others will not make healthy embryos.

Since so many things can happen, you may feel more comfortable choosing an egg donor Atlanta program that has some type of money back guarantee. In essence, these programs guarantee

members of this program a child or their money back. Although the details vary across programs, they operate in the same way, giving couples several attempts at donor cycles until they conceive a child. Experts agree that 10 to 20 eggs are ideal for conceiving a child. The couple pays into the program initially, and the goal is to allow them several tries at a fraction of the cost.

It's important not to get too absorbed in success rates, as they are only one part of the selection process. As we learn more about freezing eggs, we can find the best ways to retrieve and preserve eggs, ensuring their viability no matter which egg donor program is chosen.
