This not only reduces this feedback, but also provides some cushioning for additional comfort.

Drying Aids

Moisture is the enemy of the hearing aid. If moisture is allowed inside, it can quickly ruin the device, rendering your investment worthless or requiring costly repairs. Your goal is to keep your hearing aids dry, and some accessories can make this a little easier.

Hearing aid drying devices can be as simple as a pouch with a moisture-wicking material added or as complex as a mini-dehumidifier to store the aids inside. Hearing aid specialists can help you choose the right drying device to keep your aids functional for a long time. When using these devices, always remove the battery first.

Safety Alerts

Even with hearing aids, some alerts or sounds can be difficult to detect. Safety alerts are types of hearing aids that connect to important household alerts, like your doorbell or smoke detector, and send a signal to your hearing aid to alert you to the alarm. Your hearing aid may beep or vibrate, but the main purpose is to ensure that you know an alert has sounded and can act accordingly.

Hearing aid accessories are not required to enjoy the use of your hearing aids. Instead, they work to make life much more convenient and comfortable for you while you are using your aids. As you are adjusting to life with hearing devices, talk to your local hearing aid provider about the possible accessories that would fit your lifestyle.
