Waterproof exterior paints essentially protect the outer layer and interiors from dampening from moisture and humidity. While water seepage can cause major damage to the structure of the building, and cause the interiors to look shabby and unkempt, waterproof paints have a protective outer coat that resists moisture or water from the rains from accumulating on the walls. This results in super-shiny interiors and squeaky-clean exteriors.

Heat reflective exterior paints, significantly reduce absorbed heat in the wall by selective reflection of infrared light. They remain cool, even in dark colours, reduce thermal shock and in some climate zones negate the need for added insulation at all. Avoid the use of deep tone exteriors, (that are non-reflective) because, although they might be aesthetically appealing, add absorbed heat to the building envelope and are contrary to basic principals of energy efficiency.
