Eight characters is the minimum length required for a password as I mentioned earlier. If you can remember, make your password as long as possible. This is hard for the hackers to find out. Use all your creativity when choosing passwords or changing them.

Have any of you had the trouble of forgetting your password? Well I have a number of times. Many websites will ask you to choose a question to verify your identity. Some websites give you the option of creating your own question. Make sure that you don't create questions in such a way that the answers can be scanned from various social networking sites and blogs. Simple to say do not set passwords the normal way. Try all kinds of combinations and make it as complex as you can. Example: The question is "Where were you born?― I think most of your friends and family members would know the answer to this. If the answer is "New York―, type it as "new2522york― or any combination that you prefer. These are a few combinations that I know. If any of you knows anything more you can share it with me.
