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As we all know that it is compulsory for the citizen of a country to pay tax to its government on the income earned by him or her. Since it is a compulsory payment we all feel paying taxes as burden and due to this many people try to evade taxes using unfair means. Thus, in order to stop people from using unfair means and not paying tax, the government has provided the facility of tax exemption under certain circumstances which people can avail by Claiming Tax Relief.

Claiming Tax Relief is possible under various circumstances like natural disasters, providing your tools and equipments, medical claims, etc. Claiming Tax Relief for using your car for work purposes is also possible. Under this you are eligible for Claiming Tax Relief for almost every work travel like visiting clients, delivering goods or visiting temporary place of work. However, you cannot include the expense incurred on your daily commute to work while Claiming Tax Relief. In order to calculate the amount of claim you have to first calculate how many miles you have traveled for work, then multiply the total miles with the approved vehicle mileage rate since every vehicle has a different mileage rate. After getting the total, subtract the petrol money provided to you by your employer. Finally the difference between the total and the result obtained after subtracting the petrol money is the amount that you can claim.

You can also get Uniform Tax Allowance if you work in a company where it is mandatory to wear uniform. This means that if you have to wear a uniform at your work place you will be liable to get Uniform Tax Allowance. However, only this much information is not sufficient to get the tax relief as there are other things which you should know about Uniform Tax Allowance like:

In order to get the Uniform Tax Allowance the uniform worn by you at your work place should be such that it cannot be worn outside and it should have the logo of the company you work in.

There are different rates of Uniform Tax Allowance for different kind of work. Therefore, it is necessary to know the your rate of uniform tax relief so that you can calculate your amount of claim.

You can claim this tax relief in two ways either by submitting all receipts or through a flat rate tax deduction.

Therefore, for Claiming Tax Relief and Uniform Tax Allowance it is essential to gather all relevant information before taking any step.
