It is very important to maintain your corals as they are very fragile and easily susceptible to damage. Read on below for some of the simple ways to clean and save your coral to last a lifetime and beyond.

It's necessary to understand your coral before you get into the process of cleaning. As Coral is produced by a living organism it is quite soft, with a rating of approximately 3.5 out of 10 on the Mohs Scale of Hardness. So, at most care should be taken when you clean it. Wipe your corals with a soft damp cotton cloth and never clean it with jewelry cleaning solutions or rub it using brushes, chemicals. You can even wipe it with mineral oil to preserve the natural lust. Avoid soaking corals in liquid as it can absorb moisture and becomes brittle.

Try not to use your coral jewelry while swimming as it might discolor your precious coral jewels. Avoid wearing it when you engage in outdoor sports or when you are handling harsh chemicals as it can damage the coral. Preserve it in separate cases or jewelry boxes or even small velvet pouches to save it from contact with other jewelry. Do not store it in pile or with other harder jewelry as it can lead to scratches.

If you adore coral jewels and if you'd like to collect some of the precious pieces, the best places to try is antique stores or vintage boutiques or surf online for some of the most stunning designs. If you intend to possess an organic coral make sure you shop for a genuine piece and not a synthetic one when you pay high price. To spot the real stuff, look for white flecks and patches on the coral surface. It is really a precious treasure to own a beautiful Hawaiian piece. There are different Hawaiian corals like Black Coral, Gold and Bamboo coral, other corals that come in various colors like red, pink, orange and blue are often seen in a variety of shapes and cuts. Coral is fashioned into round, barrel-shaped, or oblong beads and is given a glossy, lustrous finish. You can look for coral ornaments as pendants, necklaces, earrings, pins, bracelets and rings with fine carvings. You can also get imitation coral made from resin, wax or wood if you'd like to contribute to the cause of protecting coral reefs.
