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If you had a stressful and difficult labor and delivery, and are worried that your infant may have sustained brain injury as the result, you should contact a hypoxia lawyer. Hypoxia is defined as a lack of oxygen to the brain, and is the number one cause of brain damage in children. Consulting with an attorney who has experience with brain injury cases is important, if you suspect that your child may be developmentally delayed.

Here are some questions that you may want to ask your attorney about hypoxia:

My child is two years old and does not speak a word, should I be concerned?

Each child's rate of development is unique to that child and kids grow at their own pace. There are babies who say a first word at 7 months, as well as toddlers who utter their first word at 18 months. Your child's doctor is in the best position to examine the child carefully, testing the different criteria used to measure normal development. He will take into consideration the overall condition of the child; his motor skills, sensory skills, communication abilities and many other aspects. Only after a thorough examination can a pediatrician opinion on whether the child is developing at a rate expected of him. If he suspects a problem, which may be caused by hypoxia, suffered during birth, he will advise you to collect your child's medical records from the beginning and consult with a neonatal specialist. If you know that an emergency arose during delivery, and the baby has not been developing since, you may want to speak to a hypoxia lawyer, who will work closely with experts experienced in recognizing when a doctor made a mistake, possibly causing brain injury to the infant.

What mistake could the doctor have made?

The birthing process is very stressful, and some events may be unforeseeable, even if the unfortunate result occurs. However, if the doctor failed to respond to the known, preventable problem in a timely matter, or failed to notice the problem, this may result in the doctor being held liable for negligence. Difficult childbirth may lead to respiratory distress suffered by the Hypoxia lawyers infant and doctor's failure to order a timely c-section, can result in complications due to hypoxia. understand what you are going through, having helped families just like yours, and will treat you with the respect and care you deserve.
