Nearly every dog will need to be treated for fleas and ticks at some point during the year. In fact, it is best to treat pets during all seasons to completely avoid any infestations. These parasites can make your pet very uncomfortable as well as carry diseases and cause medical problems. Fleas tend to reproduce rapidly, so leaving a pet untreated can lead to a problem for the entire house. Frontline for dogs kills these pests and prevents them from becoming a nuisance in your home.

Frontline for dogs is a topical medication that you apply directly onto the animal's skin. The product then soaks into the skin where the active ingredient, fipronil, is stored in the oil glands. This allows the medication to be distributed to the skin and hair continuously throughout the month. This design makes it possible for Frontline for dogs to kill fleas and ticks that make their way onto the dog after application as well as those that were already there.

This medication has been designed to provide the best protection for dogs. Whether swimming in a lake or being given a bath, your pet will probably get wet at some point, so it is vital that you use a medication that is not affected by water, mud or anything else that may end up on your dog. Fortunately, Frontline is stored under the skin and will not simply wash off.

Frontline for dogs is available in an array of doses, so it is easy to find a dose that will suit your pet. Smaller breeds and puppies will need a much different dose than large dogs. This product is labeled in a way that makes it easy for customers to choose the proper dose.

Applying this medication is also relatively easy. Every box contains several individually-wrapped applicators, which each hold a monthly dose of Frontline. You simply unwrap an applicator and snap off the tip to prepare the dose. It is important to hold the applicator upright and away from your body to avoid spilling any of the liquid medication. The tip of the applicator should then be placed between the pet's shoulder blades while you squeeze the product onto the skin. The medication should all be placed in this particular area to prevent the dog from licking or rubbing off the liquid before it soaks into the skin. You should be sure that the medication is placed directly on the skin rather than on the hair of the animal.

Once applied, Frontline for dogs should kill all fleas and ticks on your pet within twelve hours. This is an excellent way to rid your pet, and your home, of these irritating parasites as well as prevent potential health concerns.
