For businesses of today, terms like convergence, integration and synergy are so overused that it has become easy to dismiss instances when they actually happen. Security systems are a prime example. Modern security systems not only address the security needs of the facility, but of information systems as well. Thus, one type of security is “integrated”™ into the other.

Managers and executives have come to realize that security risks pose as direct threats to both facility and information systems. With security system integration, physical and data security applications are merged into a single, comprehensive system. Employees responsible for physical security become part of those responsible for the computer network security. As more Long Island business owners recognize the need to use systems that protect both facility and information systems, this approach is gaining better recognition.

Integrating various elements of a company’s™ physical and logical security systems offers a wide range of benefits. To begin with, the security system will be less vulnerable to incidents and respond better when one occurs. To illustrate, if the access control and intrusion alarms are linked, the access control system can be set to change automatically based on the type of alarm that sounds. If the system determines that there’s™ an intruder, it can lock down the computer room.

Add to that, an integrated system can provide better operating efficiencies. For one thing, calls to the IT desk will drop because employees can use one credential to access both their workspace and computer. This scenario is comparatively much better than managing multiple credentials or passwords where they are likely to forget one and therefore, have to call IT.

As security systems integration becomes even more sophisticated, the term will likely come to represent an increasingly comprehensive approach to linking various systems. For example, a growing topic among industry experts was studying how to link the security system with human resource applications. This way, when a person enters or leaves a company, the security system will be automatically changed after the human resources department updates its records.

While security systems integration makes great sense, it is often a difficult process. One challenge comes from the fact that you will need to buy everything from the same vendor. If the vendor provided only minimal support, the entire security system will be compromised, and the customer will be saddled with a system that doesn’t™ meet their needs.
