Determine which areas are vulnerable to unauthorized entry or access, and then figure out the best way to tighten access protection in these exposed areas.

Of course, you need to decide on the level of access controls needed, and what protocols you are comfortable with. There are several technologies currently in use, such as biometric access systems and possessed object access systems. If you want, you can also decide in advance on who will have access and who will be excluded.

The last thing you want for your business is for information to bleed out by way of undetected, unauthorized entries.
