Located in Berkshire County, Mortimer Common which is also known as Mortimer is a village and a civil parish of Stratfield Mortimer. The village of Mortimer is a part of the government of West Berkshire. It is at a distance of approximately 7 miles towards the South-West of Reading. Through the middle of the Mortimer, the Lockram Brook flows which later joins into Burghfield Brook towards the Northeast. The brook of Lockram gives a picturesque view to the village. Apart from the geographical location, the ground transportation facilities in Mortimer include Mortimer car hire, taxi hire, vans, buses and trains.

The large village of Mortimer has its own railway station which is operated by the First Great Western train services. Two trains per hour travel on weekdays and weekends whereas one train travels per hour on Sundays from the Mortimer Rail Station. A train from Mortimer Rail Station takes approximately 11 minutes to reach the big town of Reading and 13 minutes to reach Basingstoke. Traveling from Mortimer to any airport in the UK is easy via private cabs which are available 24 hours a day.
