The size of your room and the distance at which you normally sit to watch television is what matters most. Here is small checklist that you consider. A little less or more doesn't matter.

- 1.Screen size 15-26 in " 6-8 feet
- 2.28-36 in " 8-10 feet
- 3.36-42 in " 10-12 feet
- 4.Greater than 42 " 12 feet or more

Step # 3:

This isn't really a big step. Get to your internet connection and start looking for factory prices. Compare the discounted prices from dealers and order. In the milieu and excitement don't forget the after sales warranty. Provide some price allowance for some brands.
