Luxury train travel may be old or new. In China there have been attempts to introduce high speed trains from Beijing to Shanghai. They travel at speeds in excess of three hundred kilometers per hour on air cushions that eliminate the clanking sound of rails. Trains were not entirely luxurious. Some third class carriages were reserved for the supposedly inferior. It was when Mahatma Gandhi, a British educated lawyer but an Indian, tried to board the luxury coach of a train in Durban that he was ejected on racial grounds. This small incident had a direct link with the end of the British Raj in India.

Gandhi returned to India from South Africa, incensed and humiliated. He proceeded to organize his campaign of passive resistance and this eventually defeated British attempts to stay in India. Had he not been denied the experience of luxury travel history may not have been quite the same!

Now passengers may enjoy luxury train travel and follow along the routes followed by their forebears. An observation car will replace the third class carriages that used to be attached to the rear. As they experience the sights, sounds, touches and tastes that made up the lives of people in the past tourists may enjoy a sense of history from the perspective of the privileged.
