☛ Listen to the Students- It is true that to make people listen to you, you first listen to them. In a classroom, the teachers must listen to their students’ problem and quarries minutely and should provide solution to them.

☛ Praise the Efforts- If you students do anything worth praising, always praise them positively. But remember to maintain an standard of equality while dealing with all the students.

☛ Show Respect and Value- Always value the emotions of the students. Never use words that may hurt them and destroy the beauty of the relation.

☛ Reach Students’ Level- Being teachers, we should always remember to consider the level of understanding of the students’ first. The lectures should be easy to understand so that every student of the classroom can easily absorb it.

☛ Doesn’t Enforce the Students- Never try to enforce your wishes on the students. This may develop in them a feeling of disrespect and also can act as a hurdle in smooth teacher-student relation.

High quality academic instruction refers to instruction that is appropriate to students’ educational level, creates opportunity for thinking and analysis, uses feedback effectively to guide students’ thinking, and extends students’ prior knowledge. So always try to create an environment where

these things can be nurtured.

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
