Developed as a garment of its own in both South and North India at around the same time, Sarees are epitome of Indian culture. Sarees can be draped in several styles including Oriya, Bengali, Gujarat, Maharastrian, and Malayali. Sarees come with unstitched blouses, which can be custom stitched as per customer's requirement. Sarees come in printed, embroidered, brocade, brasso, and hand-woven version, and also in different colors including bright colors like maroon, red, green, blue, magenta and simple colors like black and white. Its softness, lightness and beautiful, elegant, caressing drape were ideally suited for all type of climates.

Starting from Rs 50/ onwards, the prices can go high up to crores of rupees. The high valued sarees are usually decorated with ornamental works and are designed by famous designers.
