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During the month of May, the city of Brighton and Hove is host to the annual Brighton Festival - England's largest multi-art form event. For instance, there are several performances showcasing the work of contemporary musical artists from both the UK and across the world. However, if you prefer more classical stylings, you're well catered for as well - there are various shows tailored towards providing visitors with the best classical music performances possible. Similarly, there are a variety of dance shows on throughout the festival (for those who like things a little more physical) as well as the aforementioned literature attractions (for those who prefer things at a slower pace).

Of course, the residents of Brighton are in the privileged position of having this incredible event on their doorstep. Those who live further afield will have to arrange travel and perhaps accommodation. A large amount of Londoners choose to visit the festival each year, and perhaps the easiest option for them is to catch a return train from London to Brighton, thus avoiding having to fork out extra for hotels. Extra services tend to be put on this route during the festival month. Visitors coming from greater distances could look at buying advance train tickets, car sharing or flying - Brighton is around an hour from Gatwick airport.

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
